Step 2: Setting up icon on server

Click 'Start' Click 'Printers and Faxes' Click 'Add Printer' Click 'Next' when Add Printer Wizard appears Select 'Local Printer' Click 'Next', "Dot" should be in 'Use the following port:' - LPT1: (Recommended Printer Port) should show in 'port window' Click 'Next', select "IBM" as manufacturer (Pawn Power outputs in IBM compatibility mode and printers must be set up in IBM emulation mode - consult printer manual) select 'Proprinter' as model Click 'Next', you may be prompted to keep existing driver - if so Click 'Next', you may be prompted to insert your "Windows CD" - do so to load driver, then Click 'Next' leave Printer Name as IBM Proprinter, "Dot" Yes to use printer as default printer Click 'Next' Click 'Next' Location: and Comment: do not need to be filled out (Leave Blank) Click 'Next' "Dot" 'No' on print test page and Click 'Next' Click 'Finish'

Windows XP - Network Server Setup

(we will use the C:\ drive as the *shared* drive and drive letter N:\ for the *network* drive throughout this example)

Step 1: Setting up shared drive

Click 'Start' Click 'My Computer' RIGHT Click on 'C:' drive Click 'Properties' Click 'Hardware' tab Click and Highlight 'C:' drive Click 'Properties' Click 'Policies' tab Remove check mark from 'Enable Write Caching' box Click 'OK' Close all windows and return to desktop Click 'Start' Click 'My Computer' right Click on 'C:' Click 'Sharing & Security' Click on the "If You Understand ... " Statement Put 'Check in Share this folder on the network box' Share Name should default to 'C' Put check in 'Allow Network users to change my files' Click 'Apply' Click 'OK' Close all windows and return to desktop

Step 1: Setting up network drive (we will use N: as the network drive in this example)

Click 'Start' Click 'My Network Places' Click 'Tools' Click 'Map Network Drive' Choose' N:' for drive letter Click 'Browse' from list select the *shared* server drive Click 'OK' Insure check mark is in 'Reconnect at logon' box Click 'Finish'

Step 2: Setting up icon

NOTE: To provide compatibility for Windows/Unix/DOS/Xenix Win XP uses a new printer redirection command. NOTE: Printers set up automatically under printers & faxes in windows must be removed before doing the following steps - ALSO, if you have used the net use statement during prior setups you must use the **net use lpt1** /delete statement to clear those

Click 'Start' Click 'Run' in the 'Open box' type 'cmd' then Click 'OK' at cursor type "CD\ and hit *Enter*. Then 'type exactly' '**net use lpt1** **servername\IBMPropr /persistent:yes**' - then press *Enter* (servername is the name you named your server) computer will respond with "The command completed successfully" type '*Exit*' and press '*Enter*' NOTE: to disable the connection: Click 'Start', Click 'Run' in the Open box type 'cmd' then Click 'OK' at cursor type "CD\ and hit *Enter*. Then 'type exactly' **'net use lpt1 /delete'** - then press *Enter* computer will respond with "The command completed successfully" type '*Exit*' and press '*Enter*'

Sizing Your Pawn Power Screen: (After setting up Pawn Power icon on your desktop) For largest Pawn Power window: 'Right Click' on empty area of desktop Click 'Properties' Click 'Settings' Set screen resolution to '800 X 600' Click 'Apply' Click 'OK'

Double Click on your 'Pawn Power' Icon and get to 'Pawn Power Main Menu Screen' 'Right Click' on 'Title Bar' Click on 'Properties' select font size of '10X18' (You might have to scroll down on the right side of the box) Click 'OK' in message window put "**dot**" in second choice to save for future use Click 'OK'

NOTE: In most versions of Windows you MUST run Pawn Power in a window!! If you attempt to run full screen you will get an **ERROR 5** during some operations
